| Brain & Behavior Research Foundation | Young Investigator Grants | Provides support for the most promising young scientists conducting neurobiological research. Basic and/or clinical investigators are supported, but research must be relevant to serious brain and behavior disorders such as schizophrenia, mood disorders, anxiety disorders or child and adolescent mental illnesses. | Anticipated to reopen in 2025 |

| Whitehall Foundation | Grants-in-Aid | Designed for researchers at the assistant professor level who experience difficulty in competing for research funds because they have not yet become firmly established. Supports researchers in life sciences doing basic biological research, namely in neurobiology. | LOI due 1/15/25 (full app due 6/1/25) |
| Radiological Society of North America | Research Scholar Grant | Supports junior faculty members who have completed resident and fellowship programs, but haven't been recognized as independent investigators. Our funding not only helps establish recipients as investigators, but also supports them as they collect preliminary data that could lead to other funding in the future. Any area of research in the <i>radiologic sciences</i> is eligible for funding. | 1/24/25 |
| Camille & Henry Dreyfus Foundation | Camille Dreyfus Teacher-Scholar Awards Program | Supports the research and teaching careers of talented early career faculty in the <i>chemical sciences</i> . | Thrasher Research Fund | Early Career Awards | Open to a wide variety of research topics. Do not focus on a particular disease, but all funded projects deal directly with <i>children's health</i> . | Concept paper due 3/18/25 (full app due 5/8/25) |
| American Cancer Society | Research Scholar Grant | For investigators within the first 10 years of an initial independent research career or full-time faculty appointment. Grant proposals are investigator-initiated and may pursue questions across the cancer research continuum, as long as they fit within an American Cancer Society (ACS) priority research area. | 4/1/25 (additional deadline: 10/15/25) |
| Pew Charitable Trusts | Grant | Must hold a doctorate in biomedical sciences, medicine, or a related field, including engineering or the physical sciences. Must hold a full-time appointment at the rank of assistant professor. Strong proposals will incorporate particularly creative and pioneering approaches to basic, translational, and applied biomedical research. | Nominations expected to open April 2025 |

| Damon Runyon Cancer Research Foundation | Innovation Award | Designed to provide support for early-career researchers who are exceptionally creative thinkers with "high-risk/high-reward" ideas that have the potential to significantly impact our understanding of and/or approaches to the prevention, diagnosis, or treatment of <i>cancer</i> . | Deadline anticipated July 2025 |

| Research Corporation for Science Advancement | Cottrell Scholars | For early career faculty with appointments in chemistry, physics, or astronomy departments. | Beckman Foundation | Beckman Young Investigator Program | Provides research support to the most promising young faculty members in the early stages of their academic careers in the <i>chemical and life sciences</i> , particularly to foster the invention of methods, instruments and materials that will open up new avenues of research in science. | LOI deadline anticipated August 2025 |
| Sloan Foundation | Sloan Research Fellowships | The two-year \$75,000 fellowships are awarded annually to early-career researchers whose creativity, innovation, and research accomplishments make them stand out as the next generation of leaders. Candidates must hold a Ph.D. or equivalent degree in chemistry, computer science, Earth system science, economics, mathematics, neuroscience, physics, or a related field. | Deadline anticipated September 2025 |
| ACLS | Fellowships | The fellowship is open to scholars at all career stages, working on or off the tenure track, who have earned a PhD in the <i>humanities or interpretive social sciences</i> , with approximately half of the awards going to early-career scholars. | Deadline anticipated September 2025 |
| Russel Sage Foundation | Pipeline Grants | For early-career scholars (Assistant Professors, Lecturers and Adjunct Assistant Professors) to support innovative research on economic mobility and access to opportunity in the US. Also interested in research focused on structural barriers to educational attainment, economic mobility, political and civic engagement, and how individuals, communities and state entities understand, navigate and challenge systemic inequalities. | Deadline anticipated October 2025 |
